Exhibition Rules

Definition of Amateur - *Not having derived an income from flowers*

There will be an entry fee of 50 cents

- ❖ All entries must be in writing on entry form obtained from this program or from the steward.
- ❖ All exhibits must have an exhibit card number (obtained from the steward).
- ❖ Exhibits must be received by the morning of the show, 12th November, 2011 by 9.15am.
- ❖ The pavilion will be open at 7.30 am to receive exhibits.
- ❖ No entries are to be removed from the pavilion until the close of the show. This will be done under supervision of the stewards.
- ❖ Exhibitors in sections A, B, C, D and E must be made or grown by the exhibitor and be of amateur status.
- ❖ If in the opinion of the judge an exhibit is incorrectly classed it may be removed by the steward and placed in the correct class.
- ❖ All persons entering this section must reside within 60kms of Neville.

SECTION A OPEN - FLORAL ART & DECORATIVE

- ❖ Entries in this section to be arranged by the exhibitor, but blooms need not be grown by the exhibitor.
- ❖ The judge will consider originality design, condition of plant material used, scale, balance, suitability of container & focal point.
- ❖ No ribbons to be used, oasis & wire allowable but should be disguised.

1. Arrangement using only Conifer foliage, cones & catkins.
2. Arrangement using 5 blooms. Foliage permitted.
3. Centrepiece arrangement for a dining table. Candles permitted.
4. Old- world fashion arrangement in bowl or vase.
5. Arrangement in a basket: Fruit & Flowers.

YOUTH SECTION B - 12 to 17 years

6. Small posy of flowers.

SECTION C - 11 years and under

7. Saucer of flowers.
8. Magic fairy garden using mainly garden material on tray or board 20 x 15 cm approximately.

SECTION D - CUT FLOWERS

- ❖ Staged in glass bottles with a small opening are best. Some containers may be available at pavilion.
